# AUDIOLOGY

### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Doctor of Audiology (AuD) degree program is a three-year, full-time, accelerated program designed for individuals interested in entering the fast-growing field of Audiology. The AuD program, offered on the San Francisco campus by the Thomas J. Long School of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, is the first of its kind in Northern California and is one of only four accelerated programs in the nation. Pacific's AuD program aims to produce graduates who are highly skilled healthcare practitioners in auditory diagnostics and rehabilitation.

### CURRICULUM

Pacific's AuD program consists of 124 total units, and combines rigorous academic exploration with clinical internship and externship opportunities. Courses include, but are not limited to:

- Anatomy and Physiology of Hearing
- Psychoacoustics
- Hearing Disorders
- Adult & Pediatric Aural Rehabilitation
- Electrophysiology Tinnitus
- Practice Management

### FACULTY

The mission of the Audiology department faculty is to prepare reflective audiologists for lifelong success by providing an excellent student-centered experiential learning environment. Our students are mentored in developing leadership, critical thinking skills and a strong commitment to their profession and society. These efforts are assisted by the department's commitment to professional growth through clinical practice, scholarly activity and service to the profession and the community.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All of the following admission requirements must be completed and submitted to the Communication Sciences and Disorders Centralized Application Service (CSDCAS) by the application deadline:

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited university
- Minimum overall GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale)
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended
- Official GRE Scores
- Three letters of recommendation
- Personal Statement

### TUITION AND FINANCING

Tuition and fees are set annually. The per-unit graduate tuition rate for fall 2016 - 2017 is \$880, plus applicable fees.

Graduate students who are U.S. citizens or eligible non-citizens may apply for federal student loans. Please contact our Office of Financial Aid for more information about financing options.
