PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The College of the Pacific Master of Health, Exercise, and Sports Sciences (MA) is a graduate-level program that consists of 32 units taught over 15, 18 or 24 months. Students complete academic courses and research at Pacific's Stockton (CA) campus.

CURRICULUM

The Health, Exercise, and Sports Sciences program offers four areas of emphasis, including sport pedagogy, coaching science, exercise physiology and sport management. Students choose a thesis or non-thesis option for completing a multidisciplinary survey of exercise science, often involving opportunities for experiential learning and collaborative research. Students acquire skills necessary for immediate success in sports-science careers and top doctoral programs across the country. Offered courses include:

- Exercise Physiology
- Applied Sport Psychology
- Applied and Clinical Physiology
- Sports Law
- Instructional Methods, Strategies and Technologies

FACULTY

Graduate students in Pacific's Health, Exercise, and Sports Sciences program benefit from close working relationships with dedicated and passionate professors. Each faculty member brings unique professional experience and academic expertise to their courses.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The MA program admission process involves a holistic review that includes factors of each applicant's background and experience.

- Completed online application
- Bachelor's degree from an accredited university
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended
- Minimum cumulative and major GPA of 3.0
- Three letters of recommendation
- Official GRE scores

TUITION AND FINANCING

Tuition and fees are set on an annual basis. The per-unit graduate tuition rate for 2016-2017 is \$1,377, plus applicable fees.

A limited number of full/part-time graduate assistantships are awarded to students in the program on a competitive basis. Graduate Assistants are granted full-tuition remission plus a stipend and are expected to work 20 hours per week.
