# PART-TIME HEALTHCARE MBA

### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Eberhardt School of Business Part-Time Master of Business Administration (MBA) with Healthcare Management concentration is a cohorted, graduate-level program that consists of 36 credits taught over the course of 24 months. This part-time, evening program gives students the opportunity to gain the skills and knowledge necessary to become leaders in the rapidly changing field of healthcare management in a convenient format with both in-person and online components. Students in the Part-Time MBA program attend class at the Pacific Sacramento campus on two weekday evenings from 6:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m.

### CURRICULUM

Eberhardt's Part-Time MBA with Healthcare Management concentration integrates foundational business competencies with an extensive exploration of the concepts most relevant to the field of healthcare management. Coursework includes, but is not limited to:

- Healthcare Law
- Health Information Systems
- Health Insurance and Finance
- Healthcare Services Management
- Healthcare Economics

- Completed online application

- Three years required, Five years work experience preferred
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended
- Resume
- Two letters of recommendation
- Official GMAT scores (limited waivers available)

### TUITION AND FINANCING

Tuition and fees are set annually. The per-unit graduate tuition rate for the 2016-2017 academic year is \$1,377, plus applicable fees.
