PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Pharmaceutical and Chemical Sciences Graduate Program (PCSP) is a full-time, 32 - 45 unit program offered on University of the Pacific's Stockton campus. Closely tied to industrial interests and trends, the PCSP program is designed to provide students with a broad understanding of pharmaceutical and/or chemical sciences, prepare students for the challenges of both pure and applied research, advance knowledge in the specialization, and to encourage fundamental discovery in the chemical, pharmaceutical and health-care science.

CURRICULUM

Pacific's PCS program offers students three degree tracks (Master of Science, Doctor of Philosophy, and a dual degree program in Doctor of Pharmacy/Doctor of Philosophy) and five focus areas offered through four departments. Concentrations offered include:

- Bioanalytical and Physical Chemistry
- Chemical Synthesis, Drug Discovery and Design
- Drug Targeting and Delivery
- Molecular-Cellular Pharmacology and Toxicology
- Pharmacoeconomics and Health Care Outcomes and Services

FACULTY

Faculty from the departments of chemistry, pharmaceuticals and medicinal chemistry, physiology and pharmacology, and pharmacy practice bring their research interest and expertise to the program. Students are encouraged to combine the talents of the faculty into a unique, student-centered and interdisciplinary program that will meet their individual education goals

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The MS program admission process involves a holistic review that includes factors of each applicant's background and experience. Applicants will need:

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited university
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended
- Official GRE scores (minimum 303 per section)
- Personal statement
- Three letters of recommendation

TUITION AND FINANCING

Tuition and fees are set annually. The per-unit graduate tuition rate for the 2016-2017 academic year is \$1,377, plus applicable fees.

A limited number of graduate assistantships and fellowships may be available for graduate students. Interested students should directly contact program staff.

Graduate students who are U.S. citizens or eligible non-citizens may apply for federal student loans. Please contact our Office of Financial Aid for more information about financing options.
