



## Doctor of **AUDIOLOGY**

### Program Overview

Pacific's Doctor of Audiology (AuD) program, offered on the San Francisco campus by the Thomas J. Long School of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, is a three-year, full-time, accelerated program designed for individuals interested in entering the fast-growing field of Audiology. The program aims to produce graduates who are highly skilled healthcare practitioners in auditory diagnostics and rehabilitation.

The AuD program is the first of its kind in Northern California and is one of only four accelerated programs in the nation. The program provides rich and diverse student clinical experiences at The San Francisco Clinic through patient visits and community outreach events.

## Requirements

All of the following admission requirements must be completed and submitted to the Communication Sciences and Disorders Centralized Application Service (CSDCAS) by the application deadline:

- Bachelor's degree  
A 3.0/4.0 GPA
- Official transcripts
- GRE scores
- Resume
- Personal statement
- Three letters of recommendation

*For international students, the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) is required*

## Tuition and Financing

Tuition and fees are set annually. The per-unit graduate tuition rate for the 2017-2018 academic year is \$914 plus applicable fees.
